The felling of trees and removal of timber and timber 2. (1) products from an area approved under subparagraph (2) in the Fauro Islands in the Western Province for the purposes of clearing timber trees for mining and airport purposes are exempted from the provisions of section 4 of the Act.

- No clear felling shall be undertaken under subparagraph (2) (1) unless the Commissioner gives prior written approval of the area to be cleared subject to the following conditions
 - the area to be cleared for mining or airport (a) development purpose be clearly marked on a map given to the Commissioner;
 - other conditions necessary to implement the (b) mining or airport development purpose, as the Commissioner may impose.
- A person who contravenes this paragraph is deemed to have committed an offence under section 4 of the Act, as if the exemption were not granted under this Order.

FOREST RESOURCES AND TIMBER UTILISATION (EXEMPTION) (NDORA ISLAND) ORDER 2011

IN exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 4(1)(c) of the Act, I make this Order –

Citation and commencement 1. This Order may be cited as the Forest Resources and Timber Utilisation (Exemption) (Ndora Island) Order 2011, and commences on the date of publication in the *Gazette*.

Felling and removal of trees

- 2. (1) The felling of trees and removal of timber and timber products from an area approved under subparagraph (2) in the Ndora Islands in the Western Province for the purposes of agricultural development and reforestation on Ndora Island are exempted from the provisions of section 4 of the Λ ct.
 - (2) No clear felling shall be undertaken under subparagraph (1) unless the Commissioner gives prior written approval of the area to be cleared subject to the following conditions—
 - (a) the area to be cleared for agricultural development and reforestation to be clearly marked on a map given to the Commissioner, which shall not at any one time exceed [...] hectares;
 - (b) no extension for additional area to be cleared to be granted until the agricultural development or reforestation has been done in the approved area already cleared to the satisfaction of the Commissioner and the Ministry responsible for Agriculture;
 - (c) other conditions necessary to implement the agricultural development or reforestation, as the Commissioner may impose.

(3) A person who contravenes this paragraph is deemed to have eommitted an offence under section 4 of the Act, as if the exemption were not granted under this Order.
