Gizo/Kolombangara Constituency (GKC) has supported Schulte's Seafood Company in Gizo, Western Province with an investment of \$20,000 in Constituency Development Fund (CDF) to boost the company's operation.

The financial assistance was part of an ongoing support of the GKC towards in-come generating activities and entrepreneurship within the constituency.

Constituency Project Officer (CPO) Wesley Nonikera handed over the assistance to the founder of the Company, Schulte Maetoloa in Gizo on 30 September, 2022.

Mr. Maetoloa said he was humbled on behalf of the company to have received the assistance from the Government through the GKC Office.

"This is a timely and huge support for our company. We have started our business in 2019 and one of our challenge is storage. Currently we only have two storage facility working at the moment with the third one under maintenance. And with this support, i believe we can be able to sort out the storage issue as the company continue to grow," Mr Maetoloa said.

Previously GKC supported the company with \$50,000. The \$20,000 was an additional support to the company for the purpose of purchasing a new storage equipment.

"If our storage is set, then our local fishermen in and around Gizo/ Kolombangara will supply more fish because at the moment we have to control the supply due to our storage capacity," Mr. Maetoloa said.

Besides the storage unit, Mr. Maetoloa said the company also ordered a proper fish smoking machine which will cater to producing quality smoked fish.

He further added that the constituency support will really boost their operations as they continue to work with local fishermen in and around Gizo.

"Our aim is to support our local fishermen meaning they will be our priority and main fish supplier which I believe will help boost our local economy and more specifically our constituency.

"The company also wants to see that our rural people also benefit from our company in terms of providing employment opportunities for our young skilled people in the constituency.

"We anticipated that in the near future this company will utilize our local fishermen with maximum benefits by giving them the avenue to help them meet their basic needs to support their families," Mr. Maetoloa said.

In terms of the products, Schulte's Fish Company's produced smoked fish, fish stake cuts and fish mince.

Mr. Maetoloa said feedbacks they recieved from their consumers was positive and they will continue to produce more for the local market.

CPO Nonikera said that the constituency office always happy to support as it believes in partnership as a way forward to improving development in the rural areas adding Schulte's Fish Company plays a vital role towards rural development aspirations.

"The constituency is pleased to support the company and hope that they will grow to support the constituency aspiration in terms of development in the rural areas within Gizo/Kolombangara constituency," Nonikera said.

MRD Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) team led by Principal Monitoring Officer Gabriel Manetiva also witnessed the handover ceremony. The M&E team was in the constituency at that time to monitor and asses funded-CDF projects in the constituency.

While acknowledging GKC and the company for the partnership, Mr Manetiva said it is MRD's sole vision to ensure all rural Solomon Islands become meaningfully participated in development activities to improve their social and economic livelihood.

Few project recipients in communities outside Gizo town including Titiana and Nusa Baruku communities were also visited by the M&E team.

Member of Parliament for GKC is Honourable Lanelle Tanangada. She is also the current Minister for the Ministry of Education and Human Resource Development (MEHRD).

The implementation of the Constituency Development Fund (CDF) programme in East Choiseul Constituency (ECC) is encouraging as it promotes unity and community participation in all its development undertaking.

A team from the Ministry of Rural Development (MRD) is currently in the constituency to monitor and verify 2020 and 2021 CDF-funded projects and can confirm that ECC is one of the constituencies in the country that are well organized with communities very supportive to their Member of Parliament and the constituency office towards implementation of their community projects.

It's obvious that infrastructure projects get most of the constituency's CDF allocation with huge portion of it invested into major community infrastructure projects like construction of new permanent classrooms, school staff houses, church buildings, community halls, guest houses, housing projects and other individual project assistance.

Development partnership is evident in ECC. The constituency office work in partnership with communities and individuals to help advance rural development that impacts their livelihoods.

"ECC put more emphasis or support into these communal projects to promote unity and community participation in our communities," Constituency Development Officer (CDO) Collin Bemama Qalokisa said.

He said that it is the commitment of the constituency office under the leadership of their Member of Parliament (MP) Hon. Manasseh Sogavare who is also the Prime Minister of Solomon Islands to support and fund establishment of community projects that can benefit everyone.


"In addition to that the constituency is also pleased to continue its support to churches regardless of whatever denomination because churches play an important role in the spiritual and social development of our communities and our country."

Most of ECC projects were implemented through community partnership or participation where constituency assist with all required hardware materials and communities implement the projects with support of timbers, sand, gravel and labour.

"Projects were identified by respective communities or community committees. The constituency office only verifies submitted proposals and facilitate delivery of whatever is requested of them. That is how we implement and utilize our CDF allocation," CDO Qalokisa explained.

"So, implementation of CDF development programmes/projects in our constituency is a shared responsibility by government through our constituency office and our communities."

MRD ends monitoring of CDF projects in Gizo/Kolombangara Constituency

The Ministry of Rural Development (MRD) Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) team has successfully ended monitoring and verification of development projects funded under the Constituency Development (CDF) in Gizo/Kolombangara Constituency (GKC) on 2nd October 2022.

Most of 2020 and 2021 projects were assessed. Project beneficiaries were also interviewed on how CDF impacted their lives.

The M&E team kicked off their monitoring in ward 12 visiting the Sausepe, Vao communities, and the surrounding communities in the southern part of Kolombangara island. The team also covered Poitete to the Guhele community in ward 26.

On the 29th of October 2022, the team visited communities in Rigi Cove, Vancouver, Kaza primary and secondary school, Kuzi, Kena, and Ghatere before they travelled on to Gizo.

In Gizo, the M&E team visited constituency-supported projects in the Gizo town area, Titiana, Nusa Baruku, Saerangi, Ngari, and Doma Tuti on the 1st of October 2021.

The team also visited an herbal and thermal therapy Clinic known as Eden National therapy clinic at mile 4 outside of Gizo town. First of its kind clinic to be established in the Western Province. The clinic also received funding from the constituency to help build it.

Gizo/Kolombangara invested most of the CDF funding in housing projects (flagship projects), community projects like water supply, and other individual projects.

Development partnership is evident in Gizo/Kolombangara Constituency. The constituency office work in partnership with communities and individuals to help advance rural development that impacts their lives.

The constituency office also worked together with Kolombangara Forest Products Ltd (KFPL) by supplying seeds for their constituents to engaged in forestry.

The M&E team also held awareness talks in some of the communities. Mainly about the goals and vision of the ministry and what is expected from their MPs and Constituency Offices.

Constituency monitoring of CDF projects is part of the MRD's ongoing activity on CDF-funded projects being implemented within the 50 constituencies.

Relevant data and information collected will support the ministry in its responsibility to assess project status and the impact the fund (CDF) has on the lives of constituents.

Not only is the data collected important, but gathering evidence on the ground by officers that constituencies utilized the funds for their intended purpose is paramount.

CDFs are allocations of public funds provided to Constituencies to support rural development initiatives as per constituency development priorities.

According to the Solomon Islands Constituency Development Fund Act 2013 (s.5) 'funds may be allocated for development purposes to individuals, group income-generating projects, or community projects.

Principal Monitoring Officer and Team leader Gabriel Manetiva highly commended the people of Gizo/Kolombangara for their support and cooperation during the M&E.

"On behalf of MRD and our Permanent Secretary Dr. Samson Viulu I would like to thank you for the hospitality and friendship you rendered during the M&E process.

"Without your support and cooperation, the M&E activity will not succeed.

"I also like to thank the Gizo/Kolombangara Constituency Officers for facilitating the smooth implementation of the M&E program and finally to your Member of Parliament," Mr Manetiva said.

The once isolated rural East Choiseul Constituency (ECC) is now connected to the outside world via the internet, thanks to Fuzionnet Company Ltd following the successfully installation of a new internet service at Kumanibae, the Constituency's Development Centre on 4th October, 2022.

This means constituency officers can now able to work from their constituency office at Kumanibae and report back to the Ministry of Rural Development (MRD) headquarter office in Honiara via emails. And also, those that access the network can now hook up with their families and friends around the country and abroad through various online communication platforms such as email, facebook, WhatsApp and even watch and download music from YouTube.

Constituency Development Officer (CDO) Collin Bemama Qalokisa said the installation of the internet service was a milestone achievement for the constituency especially on the information and communications technology aspect adding that it is time we must embrace the digital era.

He added that the internet service is part of the constituency support to the community.

Mr. Qalokisa explained that the internet service will not only use by constituency officers manning the constituency centre but it will provide services to students from surrounding schools, communities, and people (constituents) who want to do their research work/assignments.

The wireless internet service was constructed, completed, switched on and became operational on Tuesday 4th October, 2022 with MRD officers who are in the constituency on a monitoring activity that month got the privilege to become the first user of the network.

Currently the public and people who want to access the internet service can pay \$6 for an hour, a charge fee that is reasonable for rural communities. Money collected will be used to pay for the service monthly bills.

CDO Qalokisa expressed gratitude to Alphie Nelson, field Engineer from Fuzionnet Company Ltd for the job well done for the successful installation of the internet service.

"Thank you for choosing Fuznionnet for your internet and communications needs," Mr. Alphie told CDO Qalokisa.

Alphie assured CDO Qalokisa that Fuznionet is stand ready to assist whenever there is a need arises. The network service can be accessed both indoor and outdoor through hotspots/wireless connectivity in an around the constituency development centre.

The internet service project was fully funded by the Constituency Development Fund (CDF) at a cost of \$18,000.

"This awareness meeting was the first of its kind, specifically on CDF to have happen in our area. We have learned a lot from the presentations and discussions. Also, it is our first time too to learn about the important core mandates and functions of MRD," Ms. Madada said.

She thanked the MRD officers and encourages them to continue

with the good work in informing and educating our rural people on the development programmes that our government continue to deliver through the CDF programme.

Most of the participants also expressed their appreciation to the government through ECC office under the leadership of their Member of Parliament Manasseh Sogavare who is also the Prime Minister of Solomon Islands for its continuous commitment and support to development in the constituency.

They emphasized that the only way forward for us to realize true development is through partnership.

CDF-funded Lepi wharf nears completion, handover next



Lepi wharf in Gao-Bugotu Constituency (GBC) in Isabel Province is nearing completion ahead of official handing over in due course.

The wharf infrastructure is funded by the Solomon Islands Government in partnership with Peoples Republic of China (PRC) through the Constituency Development Fund Program (CDF) under the leadership of their Member of Parliament Honourable Samuel Manetoali.

Hon. Manetoali is also the Minister for the Ministry of Traditional Governance, Peace and Ecclesiastical Affairs (MTGPEA).

"Construction works are now into finishing stages," Constituency Project Officer (CPO) Francis Pilau said.

He said the wharf will serve Lepi village, Vulavu village, Midoru village, surrounding communities and the travelling public of Isabel Province.

"Making sure our people have a safe and proper wharf to load and unload cargoes is important. So, it is GBC commitment to continue to support and invest in development of such important infrastructures to stimulate social and economic activities in the constituency."

Mr. Pilau said another component of the wharf project is a market house which will be built on an extend by the wharf.

"Construction of the market house will start as long as materials are delivered onsite.

"Providing avenues where women can participate in in-come generating activities is one of GBC top priorities. So, this market house once completed will surely benefit the surrounding communities because they will have a proper house to sell their products or markets to the travelling public to and from Honiara by ships and the general community."

Other benefits that the wharf will bring include;

- Saving ships operating costs while in port.
- Induced local agriculture and marine production
- Value of time saved by people through loading and unloading of their cargoes.
- Income generation through agriculture and marine production sales.
 - Income generation through increase local market activities and

• Income generation through local participation in annual maintenance activities.

Bugao, a business arm of GBC is constructing the wharf.

Some of GBC's accomplishments include;

- Completion and handing over of Koloteve Market House project
- Completion and handing over of Vulavu clinic staff house. The project was implemented through Public Private Partnership (PPP).
- The completion of Tataba Area Health Center funded under the CDF support to strengthen the implementation of Health Program to support the delivery of better health services in the constituency.
- Establishment of the Tataba rural Police Post funded under the CDF program which is now operational to combat unwanted social issues in the constituency.
- Establishment of a first ever Court House at Tataba funded by SIG and Peoples Republic of China (PRC) through the CDF Programme. The Court house is now operational.
- Support to Lepi Fishery Center and the ongoing Rural Lightning Program to ensure constituents have access to efficient, cheap and reliable lightings.

West Guadalcanal raises constituents living standard through housing scheme program

West Guadalcanal Constituency Office (WGCO) continue to prove its steadfast committment towards improving living standard in the constituency with the support of hardware materials to constituents to build thier permanent homes.

This was after the constituency office under the leadership of their Member of Parliament (MP) Honourable Anthony Veke who is also the Minister for the Ministry of Police handed over hardware materials to 10 recipients to build their dwelling houses.

The handing over was faciliated by WGCO on 4 October 2022 at the constituency warehouse at Henderson.

"This handover kicked-off our housing scheme program phase 1 for this year 2022. The cost of the projects cost a total of \$102,000.00 as funded under the Constituency Development Fund (CDF)," Constituency Development Officer (CDO) Chris Laubua confirmed.

"The constituency had embarked on housing scheme this year. We were assisting constituents to complete their incomplete houses previously. This time round the Constituency secretariat office under the leadership of Honorable Anthony Veke had given out 10 houses per polling station," Laubua explained.

According to Mr. Laubua, they have completed delivering of housing materials for Savulei Ward and partially for Tangarare Ward.

In terms of materials, Mr. Laubua said the 1st phase of hardware materials handed over was for Hove Village. The first phase consists of cement, steel rods, tire wires, nails, and plain coppers for the post frame.

He further added that the 1st phase costs around \$102,000.00 for the 10 houses.

"Additional cost has been incurred for vehicles to load the materials to Lambi where the materials will then be taken home with OBM engines.

"As soon as the 1st phase is completed, we will proceed to phase 2 with a sight visit from the assessment teams," Mr. Laubua explained.

Mr. Laubua also told MRD that an agreement was signed with the carpenters to build the houses under the Housing Scheme program.

The agreement states "This Memorandum of Understanding (MOA) will be governed by and construed by the Solomon Islands laws and that of the West Guadalcanal Constituency Secretariate Office will have jurisdiction in respect of all matters arising under the terms of this MOA".

Meanwhile, the Ministry of Rural Development (MRD) Deputy Secretary Technical (DST) Hugo Hebala said that it was impressive to see constituencies moving in terms of using the CDF for the benefit of its rural people and witnessing West Guadalcanal moving on with the project is encouraging as it will raise the standard of living in the constituency.

The Ministry of Rural Development (MRD) has commended the Member of Parliament (MP) for South Guadalcanal Constituency (SGC) Honourable Rollen Seleso and his constituency office for their continuous support and delivery of meaningful projects to improving social and economic livelihood of its rural people.

This was after MP Seleso handed over 17 fiberglass boats and 40 horsepower Outboard Motor Engines (OBMs) with their accessories to the (first) 17 communities in his constiteuncy on 14th October, 2022.

The boats and OBMs cost 1.7 million in Constituency Development Fund (CDF). The support were recieved in Honiara by Chairmen representing the 17 communities.

The boats and OBMs were procured under the South Guadalcanal Constituency Emergency Transport Project 2022, emergency commitments.

Speaking on behalf of MRD, Principal Monitoring and Evaluation Officer Timoly Carter said the ministry is confident that the 17 chairmen who received these assets will ensure the effective and efficient management of these assets to serve their rural people.

"MRD believed that the support you receive from your MP will serve its purpose for many years to come," she added.

She further stated that MRD through its Constituency Development Programme is committed to continue facilitate support to constituencies to ensure they deliver their development priorities towards improving social and economic livelihood of all Solomon Islander.

He further encouraged the 17 communities to look after the properties and use them for the greater good of the rural people of South Guadalcanal.

Speaking for the receiving communities Francis Netana thanked MP Seleso for his continuous support through the CDF Program and assured Hon. Seleso that the communities will certainly look after the million-dollar assets.

He then thanked the national government through SGC for the generous gifts and support t which will really help communities in times of emergency.

The company also built and supplied boats and canoes for other constituencies. Hon. Seleso is the current Minister for the Ministry of Provincial Government and Institutional Strengthening.

New classroom complex for Tarama SDA primary school under construction

Tarama Seventh Day Adventist (SDA) primary school in East Choiseul Constituency (ECC) will soon have a new permanent two-story classroom building thanks to the government through ECC for funding the project in partnership with Tarama and its surrounding communities.

The new two-story complex will replace the existing rundown building that already decayed/spoiled by termite thus unfit for use.

"This project is funded by government through our constituency office in collaboration with our community support," head teacher Thomas Kolalu said.

He said education is the key to success and seeing that our constituency under the honest leadership of our Member of Parliament Hon. Manasseh Sogavare continue to render support and invest in such education project is reassuring.

"Development of our human resource is important and making sure our children (student) have a conducive classroom and space to learn is not only important but such help to the school demonstrates government through our MP's firm commitment towards human resource development in the constituency.

"We have an existing classroom but now unfit for use due to the damage cause by termite and its rundown state. This new complex once completed and usable will be a facelift for the school and the community here as a whole," he said.

"Often times we thought we were overlooked due to our remoteness, but thanks to government through ECC for helping us out in this new classroom project."

Government through ECC also funded construction of a new staff house including sanitation and water tank for the school in partnership with Tarama and its surrounding communities in 2019.

Government through the constituency office provided all-necessary hardware materials delivered in mid-2021 at a cost of \$17,280.00 and again in 2022 hardware materials at a cost of \$120,000.00 while community contribution includes; timber (s), sand, gravel and labour.

MRD Minister Hon. Dudley Kopu officially opened the two-day consultation workshop.

Minister Kopu acknowledged the participants for accepting the invitation and for their invaluable inputs and contributions towards the formulation of the policy.

"Since August of this this year (2022), in our pursuit to formulate the SICD Policy, my ministry's taskforce has been busy conducting similar consultations in Buala Isabel Province, West Guadalcanal in Guadalcanal Province, Western Province in Munda, Central Island Province in Tulagi, Auki in Malaita, Rennel Bellona Provincial Assembly members and now here at Otelo Village, Reef Islands, Temotu Province.

"The policy will try to narrow down the focus of CDF because as it is now, the scope is quite broad. The focus may concentrate on the Social Economic, infrastructures and livelihoods of the rural people," Minister Kopu said.

He added that the policy will also look at the governance of CDF, to address the accountability and transparency issues with regards to the delivery mechanism. This is to ensure the CDF aligns to the Constitution of Solomon Islands, Public Financial Management Act 2013, Public Service Regulations and other relevant legislations."

Hon. Clay Forau, Premier of Temotu Province, in his remarks on behalf of the participants, acknowledged the Solomon Islands Government through the Ministry of Rural Development to identify Temotu Province as one of the sites for Consultation on the Proposed SICD Policy.

Premier Forau further emphasized the importance for the task force to consult those who will be affected by the policy through getting their views and concern for this proposed policy to contribute to the development of fair and workable government policy framework that advances development aspirations of SI on an equitable basis.

It was a successful consultation as participants contributed constructively with invaluable ideas and views towards this crucial policy reform undertaken by the government through MRD.

Recommendations from the consultations will assist MRD task force towards reforming constituency developments.

Participants expressed their support towards the undertaking and said that the consultation is a major step in the right direction as far as rural development is concern.

They said that having a robust framework to safeguard the use of CDF is of paramount importance to guarantee meaningful developments are realized in our constituencies.

Meanwhile, DST Hebala acknowledged the participants for their participation and helpful contributions during the course of the consultation.

He said recommendations and ideas gathered from the consultation will really help MRD as it embarks on reforming constituency developments to guarantee rural people meaningfully participates in social and economic activities to improve their livelihoods.

Mr. Hebala highlighted that the SICD Policy key goals are to support and provide a policy framework towards the review of the 2013 CDF Act; and it will enhance and contribute towards empowering all Solomon Islanders to participate meaningfully in constituency development activities to improving their livelihoods.

He further said that SICD Policy shall focus on the following key thematic areas: socio-economic infrastructures, livelihoods income generating projects, essential services such as health, education and police-security, and downstream processing and value adding.

"This policy framework overall intends to guide the management and enhance the delivery of the Constituency Development Funds," he emphasized.

The Minister for the Ministry of Rural Development (MRD) Honourable Duddley Kopu has congratulated Gao-Bugotu for taking the lead towards decentralizing government services in the rural areas through the establishment of an office complex in its constituency.

Minister Kopu who is the guest of honour was speaking at the official handing over of the constituency office complex established at the Gao-Bugotu Constituency (GBC) Development Growth Centre (CDGC) at Tatamba in Isabel Province on Wednesday 26 October, 2022.

"Today is truly a historic day and a special one because this is the first such office complex in the country and among all the 50 constituencies, which was built to house government line ministries," Hon. Kopu said.

He said Gao/Bugotu has set a benchmark as the first constituency to achieve such a feat, and as a responsible ministry (MRD) who is responsible for rural development encourages others to emulate or replicate the achievement.

Minister Kopu said the opening of the office complex not only timely but aligns well with the legislative and policy reforms currently undertaken by his ministry.

Meanwhile, he said as part of the efforts by the DCGA government, to improve the delivery mechanisms and governance of the Constituency Development Fund (CDF), and reorient its focus on the productive and resource sectors including essential services, his ministry is embarking on formulating the first Solomon Islands Constituency Development (SICD) Policy.

"Among other priority areas, the new policy will pursue the establishment of 50 Constituency Development Growth Centers (CDGCs), starting next year.

"These CDGCs will house office complexes including other important facilities to decentralize government services and provide opportunities to our people.

"Under the SICD policy, MRD will partner more closely with technical ministries of the government, provincial authorities and communities and willing donor partners to roll out services to our people in the rural areas.

"These reforms also include regulating the use and disbursement of CDF focusing more on long term sustainable projects while not neglecting the social livelihoods of our people.

"And it is very pleasing to witness today that Gao/Bugotu constituency has already taken the lead through the completion of this office, and I am very encouraged by this," Minister Kopu emphasized.

The office complex is funded by CDF through contributions from the national government of Solomon Islands and the Peoples Republic of China (PRC) as well as in-kind contributions from the people of GBC.

It is a testament of partnership between the Solomon Islands Government, the Government of PRC and the people of the constituency and Isabel Province.

"Without the partnership and working together of our people and the two governments this project would not succeed. So, let me again thank the good people of Gao/Bugotu constituency for your support toward this project including other projects that are funded by CDF."

Six government ministries that will have their offices housed in the complex include the Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Tourism, Minis-

try of Environment, Ministry of Forestry, Ministry of Traditional Governance, and the Isabel provincial treasury bureau.

GBC main priority is to bring basic government services more accessible in the rural areas, thus funding of the Tatamba office complex is a fine example to guarantee rural people access needed services in their communities than travelling to Honiara or provincial capital, Buala.

Another top priority of GBC as aligned to its annual work plan is to progress economic development and provide avenues where constituents can participate in economic activities to improve their social and economic livelihoods.

Counsellor of the PRC Embassy Office in Honiara His Excellency Yao Ming was amongst invited guests that attended the program including government delegation of Permanent Secretaries and senior government officials from other line ministries.

The constituency office complex cost over \$800,000 (\$200,000 SIG and \$600,000 PRC) and was built by locals who graduated from Rural Training Centres (RTCs) with majority of funding from PRC through the CDF allocations.

The sitting MP for GBC is Honorable Manetoali who is also the Minister for Traditional Governance, Peace and Ecclesiastical Affairs.

More than 1,000 people from the surrounding communities packed the Tatamba Centre to witness the official handing over event.

CDF is implemented by the 50 constituencies through MRD purposely to improve the livelihood of people in the rural areas.

INFORMATION ABOUT CONSTITUENCY DEVELOPMENT FUND (CDF)



CDF's are allocations of public development funds provided to Constituencies to support rural development initiatives as per constituency development priorities. According to the Solomon Islands Constituency Development Fund Act 2013 (s.5) 'funds may be allocated for development purposes to individuals, group income-generating projects, or community projects.'

Where does CDF Funds comes from?

The money comes from the Solomon Islands Government (SIG) budget and donors to help communities.

CDF Goals and Objectives?

The CDF aims to help communities in these areas:

- Generate income;
- Encourage and bring about development in constituencies;
- Generally to improve the livelihoods of ALL citizens of Solomon Islands.

Who is entitled to access CDF?

The funding assistance is targeted at alleviating poverty and improving livelihoods of rural Solomon Islanders. This means every Solomon Islanders are entitle to access this fund for its intended purposes. Your consitiuency offices will draw up a Constituency Plan to help you access your priority projects to be implemented in your communities. This plan would outline the priority projects identified by the rural communities under different sectors, such as education, health, water supply and sanitation, infrastructure, telecommunications, energy, women and youth, and village development.

Ministry of Rural Development annually through its development budget has been allocated funds under the Constituency Development Funding (CDF) programme to implement the SSCD (SIG Support to Constituency Development Fund), and PRCSCD (People Republic of China Constituency Development Fund).

The CDF program consist of four main sub-projects:

- Cash Grant or Constituency Administration Funding.
- Income Generating projects.
- Water and Sanitation, Hygiene projects (WASH).
- Social Infrastructures Projects.
