

New Zealand Short Term Training Scholarships

Public Sector Leadership

Course Overview

The Public Sector Leadership course has been created to teach participants how to lead strategically and with influence in the public sector field in which they work. It will also draw on principles of good public sector leadership to support participants as they progress through their professional careers.

This is a 2-week (continuous) residential course to be held in Auckland, New Zealand.

The design, management and delivery of the course is run by staff of the Public Policy Institute at the University of Auckland. Leading expertise from the University of Auckland, the School of Population Health, and the Business School as well as industry experts who are considered world-class authorities will also be invited to present on various aspects of content to ensure the highest quality content.

Intended Participants

This course is suitable for officials with at least 5 years' work experience in the relevant course sector. Participants should have basic level computer literacy and numeracy.

To be eligible for a Manaaki New Zealand Scholarship, all the following statements must be true:

- From the date my application is submitted, I will have lived in my country of citizenship for the last two years or more.
- Exception for diplomatic corps and their family: A member of the diplomatic corps or a dependant of a member of the diplomatic corps, living outside their own country, can apply for a Scholarship.
- I am not a citizen or permanent resident of any of the following countries: New Zealand, Australia, Bahrain, Canada, any European Union country, Iceland, Israel, Japan, Kuwait, Norway, Oman, Qatar, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, South Korea, Switzerland, the United Arab Emirates, the United Kingdom, or the United States of America.
- Exceptions: People from the following countries and territories are eligible to apply:
 - Niue and Tokelau, even though they are New Zealand citizens.
 - French Pacific Territories, even though they are French citizens.
 - New Zealand-Samoan and Timor-Leste-Portuguese dual citizens.
- I will be at least 18 years old at the time I start the scholarship.
- I am not currently serving in the military.
- Within the last five years, I have not had a New Zealand Scholarship terminated.

Applicants must also acknowledge and agree that:

- They have received endorsement from my employer to attend this training programme.
- They expect to meet the academic entry requirements (including English language requirements) for my planned training programme.

Timing and Duration

The Public Sector Leadership course for participants from the Pacific will commence on **12 February 2024** and will complete on **23 February 2024**. Scholars will depart from their home country the week before the course start date.

An Orientation will be held by Skills Consulting Group on the Friday prior to course start date to provide applicants with further detail on their scholarship and allowances.

The University of Auckland will hold their Orientation with scholars on the first day of the course.

Course Structure

Each course will involve workshops, lectures, group presentations, invited speakers, and may also involve visits to stakeholders of interest (field trips). Modules will be run over two weeks (10 working days: 2 modules per day) from 10.00-4.00

- Familiarity with, and ability to apply, a range of leadership success skills drawing on the NZ Public Service Commissions Leadership Development Centre's and other models;
- Enhanced ability to identify and manage crises and risks and evaluate organisational resilience
- Understand and apply principles of inclusive leadership, policy design and delivery (with a particular emphasis on diversity, Indigenous representation and gender mainstreaming)
- Understand the importance of civic engagement and communication for impact
- Develop strategies for communicating in a culturally diverse workplace and building reciprocal relationships

Delivery Management and Presenting Team

Professor Jennifer Curtin, Director of the Public Policy Institute, oversees all aspects of the programme, is part of the introductory and completion sessions, and contributes to modules on good governance, public leadership, and inclusive trade.

Dr Suzanne Woodward and Dr Oluwakemi Igiebor are the Course Coordinators; they manage the pre-course induction process, access to our learning management system, coordinate pastoral care throughout each course, and maintain connections with scholars throughout. Suzanne and Kemi also contribute expert content on topics related to communication, participation, and inclusive leadership, and share the management of each live online session.

The Public Policy Institute appoint scholar success advisors who have knowledge of the regions from which the scholars are drawn. This is done on a course-by-course basis, to provide both intellectual and culturally sensitive care and support. The Scholar Success Adviser runs two drop-in sessions online each week and contributes to break-out room activities during each session.

Each course also has an Academic Lead: The Public Sector Leadership Course is led by Professor Jennifer Curtin. The lead contributes content and selects other relevant expert academics and practitioners.
