(L.N. No. 43 of 1978)

TEMPORARY ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY TO THE MINISTER FOR FORESTRY AND RESEARCH

IN exercise of the powers conferred by section 37 of the Constitution, acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister, I, SIR DAVID VUNAGI, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of Saint John, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Solomon Islands, assign to the person holding the office of:

MINISTER FOR FORESTRY AND RESEARCH

the responsibility for the administration of the Ministry of Mines, Energy and Rural Electrification, and for the conduct of the business of the Government of Solomon Islands and for the statutory authorities specified in the Schedule below, on and from the date of this instrument until the substantive Minister resumes duties.
